

32nd SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME (10 November)

First Reading

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel: "Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

Second Reading Heb 9:24-28

It is not as though Christ had entered a man-made sanctuary which was only modelled on the real one; but it was heaven itself, so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf. And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is not his own, or else he would have had to suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.'

He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'

Practical people will say that people like these women (in today's readings) are irresponsible and unrealistic; they should care for themselves and not risk needing others' help. Others believe that they should first take care of their own and give once they have a surplus. The two widows exemplify what it means to act like Christ. Their simple example dares others to believe that generosity, like love and the widow's jar of oil, need never be considered a limited resource. Their example can embolden others to act like they do. This is their free, courageous and faith-filled way of redeeming the world. As we near the end of the liturgical year, the church calls us to think about the meaning of our lives. The widows offer us a challenge and an inspiration. Can we become free enough to trust that love and generosity are permanently renewable resources with which we can create a different world? PARKING IN THE GROUNDS OF ST. JOSEPH'S

Although the only designated parking space is at the very forefront of the Church (for the use of hearses and official vehicles) the occasional private vehicle has generally been tolerated. Unfortunately though, in recent times, more and more people have taken advantage of the convenience of parking close to the church and it has become For Those Who Have Lost A dangerous (for pedestrians and those reversing), on top of the fact that constant damage to our reticulation system has reached new and unacceptable levels. Bituminising the space is not an option and whilst we acknowledge that there are some instances where vehicles need to be there, that would not seem to be the case for the majority of our user group. Going forward, parking will be limited to Acrod holders and funeral vehicles. Signage (in a few weeks) at the entrance will reflect these conditions. Free parking is available just across the road, on the street (for an hour) and at the very end of the Coles carpark. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause, but we really do need to address the problem and your co-operation and support will be appreciated.

RED WEDNESDAY

On Wednesday, 20 November, cathedrals around the world (including St. Patrick's) will be lit up in red to draw attention to the plight of Christians who suffer persecution for their faith. This year is focussed in particular on the suffering Christians in the Holy Land, where the people are experiencing immense hardship and struggling to remain in their homeland. Here in Busselton we are holding a Penitential Prayer Service for persecuted Christians in St Joseph's Church at 6.30pm. It will run for approximately 45 minutes. It is hoped that by standing in solidarity and love with our persecuted brothers and sisters, they will know they are not alone or forgotten. It also provides an opportunity for us to value and live out our faith more deeply.
