

# The BAPTISM of the LORD (12January)

First Reading Is 40:1-5, 9-11

'Console my people, console them,' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

Second Reading Titus 2:11-14, 3:4-7

God's grace has been revealed, and it has made salvation possible for the whole human race and taught us that what we have to do is to give up everything that does not lead to God, and all our worldly ambitions; we must be self restrained and live good and religious lives here in this present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of our great God and saviour Christ Jesus. He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good. When the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.

## <u>REFLECTIONS</u>

Sometimes things are not what we expect, and sometimes we need reassurance that everything is okay. If Jesus had heard John's description of what he would be like, it might have felt daunting. We can imagine him thinking, "I'm only a carpenter following the call of God. I'm not sure I can call down fire to baptise people, and I don't have a winnowing fork." All the same, Jesus followed what he believed to be his vocation and accepted baptism from John. Then he heard the reassurance he needed. "You are my Son and I'm very pleased with you." If you went to the Jordan today expecting quiet reverence, which would allow you to have an encounter with God, you might find the barbed wire, the mines and the general noise and mayhem rather off-putting. But God is not always found in the places where people show respect. If you visit the Sistine this land on which Chapel in Rome, you might encounter someone enforcing respectful silence by loudly "shushing", and you might find it destroys the holy atmosphere it is intended to preserve. God is to be found in the midst of the hubbub and chaos in which we sometimes live our lives. Perhaps, if we pay attention, we are more likely to find God in the places where conflict and trouble exist. And, listening immemorial. We pay our carefully, we might hear God say, "Yes, it is good that you are here. You are my beloved child and you are exactly where you need to be to show people how much I care about them." Jesus went off into the desert to prepare himself for what was to come, strengthened by God's words.
