

## 33<sup>rd</sup> SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME (17 November)

First Reading Dan 12:1-3

'At that time Michael will stand up, the great prince who mounts guard over your people. There is going to be a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence. When that time comes, your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book. Of those who lie sleeping in the dust of the earth many will awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting disgrace. The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity.'

Second Reading Heb 10:11-14

All the priests stand at their duties every day, offering over and over again the same sacrifices which are quite incapable of taking sins away. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

So with you, when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

### **REFLECTION**

Today's Gospel presents an apocalyptic vision of the end of the world. In this vision, the sun, and the moon and stars, which seem so stable, are suddenly shaken violently and come crashing down. Hopefully none of us will experience the end of the world in this way. But we can all experience times when our personal worlds seem to be falling apart and crashing all around us. Perhaps some structures that were very important to us, and that we thought would always be there, have collapsed. Or perhaps some people, on whom we relied greatly, are suddenly taken from us. We feel that our world has come crashing down.

These are terrible experiences but they can also be moments of grace, moments in which we experience the Lord entering our lives with great power and glory, as today's Gospel describes. We can experience God's presence in some way that inspires in us a joy and confidence that our actual situation cannot justify. Our being is uplifted: our heart rejoices, our soul is glad, even our body rests in safety. We learn to place all our hope in God. We pray with confidence, *'Keep us safe, O God, you are our hope.'*(God's Word 2024)

### **WORLD DAY OF THE POOR**

On (today's) World Day of the Poor, the everyday person can make a difference in the lives of those less fortunate. Simple actions like offering a meal, donating clothing or volunteering at a local shelter can provide immediate relief to those in need, but it's not just about giving material things, showing kindness and respect can have a lasting impact as well. Listening to someone's story, acknowledging their humanity and offering a moment of connection can lift their spirits and remind them they are not forgotten. .... When we open our hearts to others, we not only change their lives but often transform our own in the process. Small acts of kindness can spread and inspire others to do the same, creating a kinder and stronger community. Even the smallest gesture can make a big difference and lead to meaningful change. Pope Francis said, "We need to make the prayer of the poor our own and pray together with them. This is a challenge we must embrace and a pastoral activity that needs to be nurtured."

Lord, open our eyes to the struggles of others.

Fill our hearts with kindness and let our actions spread hope.

Help us to show Your love in everything we do, supporting those in need and working for a more just and compassionate world.

It is hoped that by standing in solidarity and love with our persecuted brothers and sisters, they will know they are not alone or forgotten. It also provides an opportunity for us to value and live out our faith more deeply.

### **PARKING IN THE GROUNDS OF ST. JOSEPH'S**

Although the only designated parking space is at the very forefront of the Church (for the use of hearses and official vehicles) the occasional private vehicle has generally been tolerated. Unfortunately though, in recent times, more and more people have taken advantage of the convenience of parking close to the church and it has become dangerous (for pedestrians and those reversing), on top of the fact that constant damage to our reticulation system has reached new and unacceptable levels. Bituminising the space is not an option and whilst we acknowledge that there are some instances where vehicles need to be there, that would not seem to be the case for the majority of our user group. Going forward, parking will be limited to **Acrod** holders and funeral vehicles. Signage (in a few weeks) at the entrance will reflect these conditions. Free parking is available just across the road, on the street (for an hour) and at the very end of the Coles carpark. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause, but we really do need to address the problem and your co-operation and support will be appreciated.

#### **NOVEMBER MASSES**

The month of November each year is a time when we especially remember in our prayers all those who have died. All Masses celebrated during November are offered for the repose of the souls of all the faithful departed. During this time, we have remembrance boxes on the sanctuaries of both our churches which you may place inside a November Mass Offering envelope with the name of departed loved ones.
