First Reading Jer 31:7-9

The Lord says this:

Shout with joy for Jacob! Hail the chief of nations! Proclaim! Praise! Shout!

'The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel!' See, I will bring them back from the land of the North and gather them from the far ends of earth; all of them: the blind and the lame, women with child, women in labour: a great company returning here.

They had left in tears, I will comfort them as I lead them back; I will guide them to streams of water, by a smooth path where they will not stumble.

Second Reading Heb 5:1-6

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever .

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road

REFLECTION

Unlike James and John in last week's Gospel, the faith of Bartimaeus in Jesus is simple and straightforward. He does not want a place of honour and glory. He simply wants to see. And he believes that Jesus of Nazareth, Son of David can restore his sight. When his sight was returned to him, Bartimaeus followed Jesus. Not just along the road where he had sat for years as a beggar. But along the road of discipleship. In every sense of the word, Bartimaeus can now see the way. Not only is Bartimaeus healed of his physical blindness, but he is also healed of the blindness of unbelief, the blindness of not following Jesus. Bartimaeus can see that Jesus is the Way; the one to follow. He is also the only one, healed by Jesus, who follows him.

The author of Mark's Gospel has placed this story at the very end of the public ministry of Jesus. If we were to read on Mark's Gospel, the very next verse would be the account of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Three times now, Jesus has predicted that he will be put to death. Three times Jesus has told us that the road of discipleship involves following him to death, then, and only then, to glory. This is what discipleship in the kingdom is all about. Simple straightforward faith that allows us, like Bartimaeus, to see clearly the road of discipleship. Simple straightforward faith that allows us, like Bartimaeus, to walk that same path. 

HOLY WATER DISPENSERS

Holy Water dispensers have been installed in the cloisters of both of our churches. These dispensers are designed for you to collect Holy Water to take home, allowing you to bring this powerful sacramental into your daily life for personal prayer and blessings. You may use Holy Water to bless yourself and anyone or anything under your care including your children, your homes, your cars, your vegetable gardens, your workspaces, and your pets.

Holy Water is a sacramental. "Holy Mother Church has...instituted sacramentals. These are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments. By them [we] are disposed to receive the chief effect of the sacraments, and various occasions in life are rendered holy." (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1667)

Through the use of Holy Water:

- We recall our Baptism where we are made new creatures, adopted as children of God the Father, purified from all sins, and made temples of the Holy Spirit.
- We are forgiven of venial sins.
- Distraction from prayer is removed.
- The power of evil over people and places is dispelled.
